PURPOSE OF MEETING: The State of Nevada has completed and made available for public review and comment the following: The amended Citizen Participation Plan for the use of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Funds for the CDBG, HOME, Housing Trust Fund, Emergency Solutions, and HOPWA Grant Programs.

Copies of the plan are available for public review and comment beginning **January 15th** in the Governor's Office of Economic Development and the Nevada Housing Division, in all City and County Administration offices (except Reno, Sparks, and city and county offices of Clark County).
